

Tom Paulson's Music Notes

If you've ever received an email from me, you know that my email signature includes the quote, "Do justice, love kindness, walk humbly." Micah 6:8 is one of my favorite Bible verses because I believe if we had more justice, kindness, and humility, we could make this a better world for everyone. I want to do everything I can to make this a better world and encourage others to do the same.

It should be no surprise, then, that we often sing the song *Do Justice*, by Larry Olson & Julie Hennies, in worship. It is a great song! Verse 1 says:

"Racing around, chasing idols, unfulfilled, empty vessels, World on the edge, out of control. Will we survive, God only knows. Do justice, love kindness, walk humbly with our God, with our God."

Do we spend too much of our lives "racing around" chasing the wrong things? Are our lives full of money, power, prestige, etc., but we still feel unfulfilled, lonely, and lost? Perhaps we are looking for the wrong things in the wrong places. The prophet Micah preached against injustice, meanness, pettiness, and pride. He encourages us to live our lives full of the love of God, with a higher purpose and meaning, leaving the world a better place than we found it.

This song puts a New Testament twist on this Old Testament prophet's voice. Verse 3 says:

"Deadly hunger, desperate crying, wounded living, people dying, Nails in the flesh, piercing fear, why can't we see Christ hanging here? Do justice, love kindness, walk humbly with our God, with our God."

I encourage you to find a way to take these words to heart, even if they just become a part of your email signature. You never know who might need to see them next!
