Music Note

This praise and worship song was written by Martin J. Nystrom, with the lyrics based on Psalm 42:1 – “As the deer pants for the water, so my soul longs for You; You alone are my heart’s desire, and I long to worship you.” This arrangement for handbells rings out the longing that permeates the season of Advent and the great anticipation for the Savior of love and peace to come among us once again.

SCRIPTURE READING Isaiah 7:10-16

¹⁰ Again the Lord spoke to Ahaz, saying, ¹¹ “Ask a sign of the Lord your God; let it be deep as Sheol or high as heaven.” ¹² But Ahaz said, “I will not ask, and I will not put the Lord to the test.” ¹³ Then Isaiah said, “Hear then, O house of David! Is it too little for you to weary mortals that you weary my God also? ¹⁴ Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Look, the young woman is with child and shall bear a son and shall name him Immanuel. ¹⁵ He shall eat curds and honey by the time he knows how to refuse the evil and choose the good. ¹⁶ For before the child knows how to refuse the evil and choose the good, the land before whose two kings you are in dread will be deserted.

Still, Still, Still (Tradition German Carol, arr. William Berry)

Music Note

This Austrian Christmas carol and lullaby’s melody is a folk tune from the district of Salzburg, with the modern German text attributed to Georg Götsch. The words describe the peace of the infant Jesus and his mother, Mary, as she sings him to sleep. The soaring notes of this lullaby in today’s brass arrangement by William Berry bring a peace of their own, offering a moment of breath and reflection on the miracle of Immanuel.

Great, great, great, love is exceedingly great. God has left the throne of heaven and must travel the roads. Great, great, great, love is exceedingly great! (verse 3)

SCRIPTURE READING Isaiah 58:6-12

⁶ Is not this the fast that I choose: to loose the bonds of injustice, to undo the straps of the yoke, to let the oppressed go free, and to break every yoke? ⁷ Is it not to share your bread with the hungry and bring the homeless poor into your house; when you see the naked, to cover them and not to hide yourself from your own kin? ⁸ Then your light shall break forth like the dawn, and your healing shall spring up quickly; your vindicator shall go before you; the glory of the Lord shall be your rear guard. ⁹ Then you shall call, and the Lord will answer; you shall cry for help, and he will say, "Here I am." If you remove the yoke from among you, the pointing of the finger, the speaking of evil, ¹⁰ if you offer your food to the hungry and satisfy the needs of the afflicted, then your light shall rise in the darkness and your gloom be like the noonday. ¹¹ The Lord will guide you continually and satisfy your needs in parched places and make your bones strong, and you shall be like a watered garden, like a spring of water whose waters never fail.

¹² Your ancient ruins shall be rebuilt; you shall raise up the foundations of many generations; you shall be called the repairer of the breach, the restorer of streets to live in.

Music Note

The tune for this familiar Christmas hymn, Regent Square, was composed by Henry T. Smart, who was regarded for his improvisational skills and continued his work as an organist even after becoming blind in 1865. The text, written by James Montgomery in 1816, compels all those listening to join with the choir of angels, the group of shepherds, the wise sages, and all creation in proclaiming, “Come and worship Christ, the newborn king!” Today’s handbell arrangement by Cynthia Dobrinski captures the joyful magnitude of this traditional hymn while also honoring the less joyful moments found in life on this earth, proclaiming that Christ enters into it all.

SCRIPTURE READING Matthew 1:18-25

¹⁸ Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be pregnant from the Holy Spirit. ¹⁹ Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to divorce her

quietly. ²⁰ But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, “Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. ²¹ She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins.” ²² All this took place to fulfill what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet: ²³ “Look, the virgin shall become pregnant and give birth to a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel,” which means, “God is with us.” ²⁴ When Joseph awoke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took her as his wife ²⁵ but had no marital relations with her until she had given birth to a son, and he named him Jesus.

Advent 2025: “In Days to Come”

Welcome to the season of Advent! We begin the church year waiting for the arrival of our Savior and yearning for the hope that he brings to our broken world. This year, we will watch as a tree grows and transforms in our Sanctuary, highlighting the Biblical themes that we hear from the books of Isaiah and Matthew each week of Advent.



Advent Week 1

“Plant and Wait”

(Isaiah 2:1-5 & Matthew 24: 36-44)

We gather around and under the tree that is bare, perhaps appearing as though it is not alive, but we look to the coming of our Savior to prove us wrong and bring light, life, and transformation.



Advent Week 2

“Grow in Hope”

(Isaiah 11:1-10 & Matthew 3:1-12)

We hear from the prophets, Isaiah and John the Baptist, foretelling of the One who is coming, and the hope that grows from this good news, quite similar to the hope that is found in the waters of baptism.



Advent Week 3

“Blossom with Joy”

(Isaiah 35: 1-10 & Matthew 11:2-11)

We experience brilliant imagery of life bursting forth from parched places, strength amid fear, peace among enemies, and life renewed through the healing love of the Savior to come.

We also witness life and joy through the voices of the youngest among us as they tell the story of Jesus’ birth.



Advent Week 4

“A Promise of Peace”

(Isaiah 7:10-16, Isaiah 58: 6-12, Matthew 1:18-25)

Immanuel/Emmanuel, God with us, is the theme of this day, as we embrace the promise of peace that is proclaimed through word and song in the texts for the day, and the offerings of Crown of Glory’s musical ensembles in the annual Christmas Cantata. The tree reflects the light-filled promise as it twinkles throughout the service, reminding us of the heavens that will be filled with angels in just a few short days.

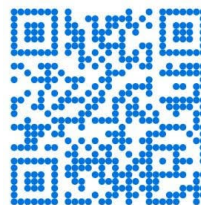
