Tom Paulson's Music Notes

In planning Lutheran worship, the lectionary prescribes four readings for each Sunday – an Old Testament (or Hebrew scripture), a Psalm (usually chanted or sung), a New Testament reading, and a Gospel. Each reading has a response for the congregation. In our worship, it is, "Word of God, Word of life. Thanks be to God." The Gospel is held in especially high esteem because it is the words and deeds of Jesus, and so tradition asks that we sing an acclamation, and stand in respect. I want to focus on that acclamation for a minute.

Often that acclamation is "Alleluia! Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life." These are the words Peter asks Jesus in John 6:68. Notice that the question is about scripture, is rhetorical, and is asked by a faithful follower of Jesus.

This fall, we are singing two songs from the ELW as our acclamations, alternating Sundays: *Lord, Let My Heart Be Good Soil* (ELW 512) and *Open Your Ears, O Faithful People* (ELW 519). The words of each song, like Peter's, are about scripture, are spoken by a faithful follower, and seem rhetorical, as if we already know the answer. 512 is a personal prayer sung in a contemporary, ballad style – "Lord, let my heart be good soil, open to the seed of your word." 519 is a prophetic (Amos? Micah?) admonition sung to a traditional Hasidic tune – "Open your ears, O faithful people...Open your hearts, O royal priesthood..." As worship is both a personal and a community event, I appreciate that we sing both. As worship is an event that should be built on tradition and help us envision the future, I appreciate us singing both an old Jewish song and a new pop song. Both put scripture into context for us, which is the job of a good acclamation.
