

Summer Finance Corner

After a cold and rainy spring, we are seeing hints of summer as we come into May. However, our financial future continues to look gloomy.

From a financial perspective, the first four months of 2022 did not live up to our hopes and financial goals. We are currently nearly \$38,000 in the red on a cash basis for the year. We did not experience any increase in offerings associated with the Easter season in the month of April. In previous years, we have been able to work our way through giving shortfalls due to a significant amount of cash reserves in our general operating fund. Two years ago, in April of 2020, we had about \$158,000 in our cash reserve accounts. One year ago, in 2021 at the end of April, we had over \$125,000 in our cash reserve accounts. In April 2022, we only have slightly under \$40,000 in our cash reserve accounts. Over the last year, we used cash reserves to pay down some of the personal loans that were due and to cover the budget revenue shortfall for 2021.

Over the first four months of 2022, our average monthly offerings and revenue were \$53,558 compared to our average monthly expenses of \$62,747. This yielded an average monthly shortfall of \$9,189. That is nearly a 15% shortfall of revenue vs. expenses. During the summer months, we usually experience a decrease in our average monthly giving numbers as our attendance drops as members of our congregation enjoy their weekends at a lake cabin or take an extended vacation. If this proves to be true in 2022, our cash reserve will be down to zero before the end of the summer. That will require some very difficult decisions by our Church Council on ways to reduce or eliminate some expenses. Our expenses breakdown this way: 48% staff, 32% mortgage, 20% other (12% general and admin; 5% facilities/maintenance; and 3% ministries/benevolences).

We are asking that you consider increasing your weekly/monthly giving by 15% to help us offset our shortfall and to reduce the pressure on our cash reserves. Or please consider a larger one-time gift that will help us get through the summer months.

Thank you for considering helping your church continue to be a strong part of our community.

Strategic Planning Team Update

On May 17, the Strategic Plan Team concluded the first phase of our dreaming, writing, and creating together. We would first and foremost like to express our deepest gratitude and prayerful appreciation for the support and feedback we received from so many members of this congregation.

Our team has met regularly since Holy Week – a feat in and of itself, considering our group consists of our two pastors and our Director of Worship and Music. We have worked with and been mentored by Dr. Ronald Thomas of the Department of Instructional Leadership and Professional Development at Towson University near Baltimore, Maryland. His



expertise was tantamount not only to our fundamental understanding of mission and vision, but also to our ability to work seamlessly as a team to create a mission statement on behalf of the entire Crown of Glory community. This was not a responsibility that we took lightly, but it was one that we embraced and enjoyed thoroughly.

With continued momentum and hope for the future, we are excited to share a working draft of a new mission statement for Crown of Glory:

We are one family of God, inspired by the Holy Spirit to welcome everyone, to serve our neighbors, and to share God's love and saving grace.

Note that this is a draft statement. It is not set in stone. We need your help to make this draft statement a final mission statement that is fully embraced by all of Crown of Glory.

Next steps:

- 1. Attend a discussion session around the draft statement. We want to hear your thoughts! Look for opportunities to join an in-person or virtual discussion sometime in June, as well as a survey that will allow you to share your thoughts.
- 2. In the meantime, feel free to reach out to our chairperson or any member of the team to share your thoughts or ask any questions. We truly want to hear from you.

Our most important takeaway from this entire process is that the statement we have written together will become a living, breathing document for Crown of Glory. These are words that we all will experience and live every day. They were created by a few, but they belong to all of us. Because words only matter when they lead to action.
