Council Corner

Possibility Starts with “Yes!”

As I prepared to write this Crownicle article, I was inspired by a recent presentation given by my son, Max to prospective incoming freshman students at the University of North Dakota. Max works for the Office of Admissions at the University of North Dakota and is often called upon to speak to prospective students. Earlier this year, I was an audience member at his presentation themed, just say “Yes!” In his presentation, he discussed the many times he was presented with an opportunity to attend an event or join a group. Often, it wasn’t something he had been planning to do with intention or always inspired to do but he said “Yes” anyway, open to the possibility. In the best-case scenario, it might lead to opportunities (and in his case it certainly did), and even if not, it was an opportunity to connect with a new person.

I have had this experience myself several times at Crown of Glory. Many years ago, there was a posting in the church bulletin asking for help with Human Resource duties for the church. I didn’t know a lot of people at church at the time, but this was a match to my professional background, so I decided this was a good way to get more involved. It paved the way for me to connect with the Pastors and to offer help in a way that was comfortable and familiar to me. Several years after that, I received an email from Pastor Reggie asking me to consider being a confirmation guide. I felt that I “should” volunteer, a little more in the spirit of it being my duty as a parent and I should take my turn. It was a busy day at work, and I didn’t read the email thoroughly. Because of that, I thought I was signing up for a one-year volunteer commitment, not realizing it was three years. The Holy Spirit was working there because if I had realized it was three years, I might have said, “No.” It turned out to be such a rewarding experience in many ways. I was blessed to have a wonderful partner in Scott Firman and truly enjoyed getting to work with him and getting to know him better. I also found the lessons very impactful, and I learned so much experiencing this again as an adult. Two years ago, Deb Mangen asked me to consider being a part of church council. I didn’t say “Yes” right away and if I am being honest, I was searching for ways to decline. But, in the end, I said “Yes” and again have been blessed with the opportunity to connect with other members of Crown of Glory that I know I would not have had the chance to know in the same way I do now. I have experienced first-hand the power of “Yes” and how it has led to deeper connections to people and to my faith.

The next time you think, “I don’t know that person, I should introduce myself,” or “I could volunteer, but I have never done that kind of activity before,” I encourage you to move past the hesitation and say, “Yes!” We all have different gifts, and they are all welcome here. From First Corinthians 12:20, “As it is, there are many parts, yet one body.” I encourage you to share your gifts, whether it be your resources, your talent, or your time. You are an integral member of the body of Christ. Not only will you be contributing to Crown of Glory, but I am certain you will be filling your cup as well!

Throughout the 2025 fiscal year, Crown of Glory was faced with the challenge of a reduced budget in areas such as staffing and ministries. It has been incredible to observe this congregation's remarkable response to the financial challenge, allowing us to sustain our ministries and our overall budget. As we look now to the 2026 fiscal year, we hope to grow our future together by increasing our giving and building our staff. To bring our goals to fruition, your commitment and faithful stewardship are vital to the life and ministry of this congregation.

Crown of Glory has also grown this past year! Throughout 2025, Crown of Glory members stepped forward to serve through various fundraising events that supported our Sustaining Fund and our future. In May, over 30 volunteers, led by volunteer coordinator Sarah Morrow, hosted a Rummage Sale and raised over \$9,500! This past summer, over 35 members, led by volunteer coordinators Deb Peterson and Mikel Jones, served on our Minnesota Twins Fundraising Team as they worked concessions at the summer ball games raising about \$7,700. Two additional fundraisers at the Carver County Fair and a Clean Up Crew for the Minnesota Twins stadium raised another \$1,500. These fundraisers impacted our fiscal year by almost \$18,000! We are incredibly grateful to all our volunteers for the stewardship of their time and talents that made this year's fundraisers such a success.

I am excited for the opportunity to join you for the rest of our stewardship season, close out our 2025 fiscal year, and meet the new challenges and opportunities ahead in 2026. The giving of your time, talents, and gifts is vital to our mission as we grow together in our faith. My sincere thanks for your continued commitment and the generosity of your shared gifts, your partnership and support, and most of all, your renewed faith in our future.

Advent and Christmas 2025

“In Days to Come”

Friends in Christ,

I find that at this stage of the season, there are two groups of people: one group is delighted that cooler weather has finally arrived and are also possibly excited for the arrival of the first snow of the season, and the other group is sad that the extended summer temperatures are gone for good and that the cold months are fast approaching. Whatever group you find yourself in, or maybe somewhere between the two, one thing holds true for all of us: Advent and Christmas are on their way. In just a few short weeks, our sanctuary will be covered in royal blues and shimmery golds, and we will begin the weekly ritual of lighting a candle on our Advent wreath and anticipate the coming of our Savior, Emmanuel.

The Worship Arts Team has been hard at work studying the Scripture passages for Advent and Christmas and reflecting on the themes that resonate most deeply. This year, the theme for Advent and Christmas is entitled, “In Days to Come.” As one community of faith, we will wait and watch for Jesus and embrace the growth in our faith and in our community that will transpire throughout the four short weeks of Advent. Along with lighting a candle each week of Advent, we will visually encounter the process of growth and change through the installation of a tree at the back of the Sanctuary. This tree will represent life, faith, and the imagery found in both the Old Testament and Gospel readings for each Sunday of Advent and Christmas Eve.

Each week of Advent will have a sub-theme that is taken from the books of Isaiah, Matthew, and Luke that directly fits within the larger seasonal theme, “In Days to Come.” I invite you to read through the list on the next page for each week of Advent and Christmas Eve to discover what we will be reading, learning, and experiencing together in worship for these five weeks.

I invite and encourage you to join us for worship throughout Advent and Christmas! In addition to worship, a few special events will be taking place in December: the Children’s Christmas Narrative during worship (in place of the sermon) on Sunday, December 14 and the Christmas Cantata (featuring all Crown of Glory’s music ensembles) on Sunday, December 21 at 9:00 a.m. The Crown Brass will also be playing a delightful set of Christmas carols during coffee fellowship after the Cantata.

I look forward to waiting, growing, and watching with you in the days to come as we prepare to welcome Emmanuel among us once again.

Advent Week 1

“Plant and Wait”

(Isaiah 2:1-5 & Matthew 24: 36-44)

We gather around and under the tree that is bare, perhaps appearing as though it is not alive, but we look to the coming of our Savior to prove us wrong and bring light, life, and transformation.



Advent Week 2

“Grow in Hope”

(Isaiah 11:1-10 & Matthew 3:1-12)

We hear from the prophets, Isaiah and John the Baptist, foretelling of the One who is coming, and the hope that grows from this good news, quite similar to the hope that is found in the waters of baptism.



Advent Week 3

“Blossom with Joy”

(Isaiah 35: 1-10 & Matthew 11:2-11)

We experience brilliant imagery of life bursting forth from parched places, strength amid fear, peace among enemies, and life renewed through the healing love of the Savior to come. We also witness life and joy through the voices of the youngest among us as they tell the story of Jesus’ birth.



Advent Week 4

“A Promise of Peace”

(Isaiah 7:10-16, Isaiah 58: 6-12, Matthew 1:18-25)

Immanuel/Emmanuel, God with us, is the theme of this day, as we embrace the promise of peace that is proclaimed through word and song in the texts for the day, and the offerings of Crown of Glory’s musical ensembles in the annual Christmas Cantata. The tree reflects the light-filled promise as it twinkles throughout the service, reminding us of the heavens that will be filled with angels in just a few short days.

Christmas Eve

“Love Has Come”

(Isaiah 9: 2-7 & Luke 2:1-20)

We move from waiting, “In Days to Come,” and celebrating that “Love Has Come” on Christmas! The life that abounds from the manger is reflected in the colors and life that bursts forth from the tree and encapsulates the Sanctuary, all the way to the cross. We join with the angels and all creation in singing praises to God for the gift of Love.





SPARK Ministry

SPARK is off to a great start this fall! We have 25 kiddos registered for Sunday School! Each Sunday we sing together, learn about a Bible Story, and do a craft. This fall we started singing some of the songs that the kids learned during VBS. It was so fun hearing them sing “We are the Church” and “Everlasting Love” with enthusiasm. We had several volunteers come help us with music this fall who all have a background in camp songs, and could even accompany us on guitar!

We are currently singing songs in preparation for the Children’s Christmas Narrative. The Narrative will take place during worship on December 14, 2025 starting at 9:00 a.m. The kiddos will be reciting, “A Very Merry Christmas Prayer” based on a book by Bonnie Rickner Jensen and adapted for our congregation.

Having volunteer support is crucial to our **SPARK Sunday School program**. Each week we need at least 2 adults. Many hands make light work, so consider volunteering for at least 2 Sundays during the year! There is a January - May sign up available for SPARK on the [website](#). One volunteer is the **Leader** and one, or more, volunteer(s) is the **Helper(s)**. Both the Leader and Helper(s) receive the lesson ahead of time by email. The Leader and Helper(s) are expected to preview the lesson so that they are prepared to lead. The Leader will do more of the reading and teaching (from a script). All art materials, coloring pages, and any needed items will be prepared and ready in the SPARK office prior to Sunday morning. The Helper(s) is there to assist the Leader.

We would love to have a helper in the **Kiddos’ Corner** during worship. This volunteer will oversee the children, making sure they are playing safely and quietly. The volunteer will tidy-up the area at the end of the worship service. The volunteer does not take the place of a parent, and parents need to be aware of their own children. If a child is being disruptive or uncooperative, it is the parent’s responsibility to remove the child, not the volunteer’s. Children will return to worship when they are ready.

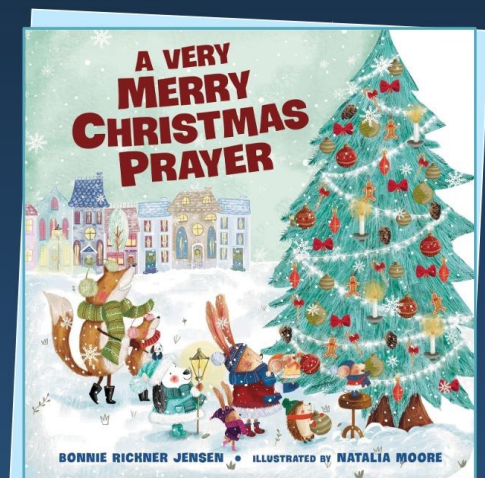

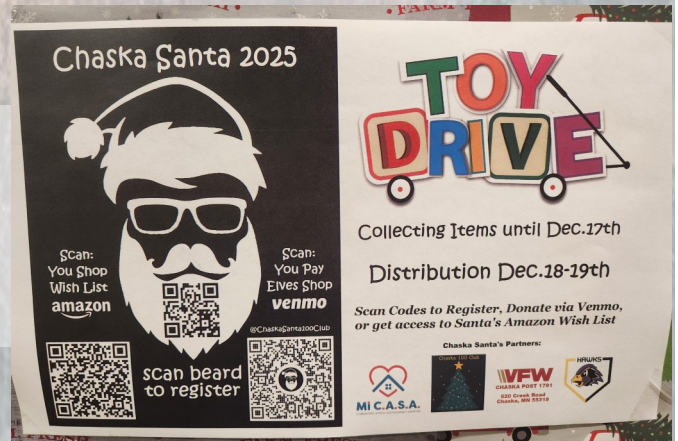

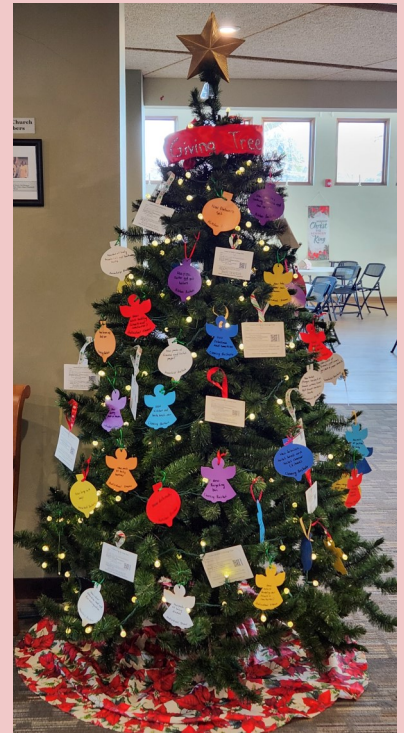

Finance Corner

Crown of Glory Lutheran Church – Financial Highlights

We give thanks this season for generosity, ministry growth, and faithful stewardship. Here's a quick look at where we stand through October 31, 2025:

Income Summary

- Total Revenue: \$568,522 (*ahead of budget by over \$22,000*)
- Contributions: \$444,942 — YTD above expectations by \$6,520. Contributions exceeded expectations in 6 of 10 months this year, however, October giving was significantly lower than anticipated by nearly 17%. Your continued support and generosity through the end of the year will be essential to maintaining our momentum and meeting our goals for 2025.
- Rent & Facility Use: \$84,396 — thankful for partnership support
- Special Events & Fundraising: \$19,447 raised
- Other Income: \$20,016 — includes Thrivent donations, Wednesday night dinners, hospitality, and program fees

Expense Overview

- Operating Expenses: \$408,557 (*86% of annual budget*)
- Mortgage Payments: \$189,568 (*on track and consistent*)
- Net Position: Ahead of overall budget by more than \$10,000

Fundraising Highlights

Our church family came together for several events this year to support our mission and community outreach. Through generosity, volunteer hours, and joyful fellowship, we raised a total of \$19,447 across multiple events — a testament to the spirit of giving that continues to thrive in our congregation.

- Rummage Sale – Raised \$9,539, exceeding its \$6,000 goal by over \$3,500! A huge thank-you to everyone who donated, organized, and helped set up.
- Twins Fundraiser (*Concession Sales*) – Brought in \$8,580. This was our first time participating in this fundraiser. Thanks to those who organized this great opportunity for us. Our participation in this fun event really brought our community together.
- Carver County Fair (*Set-up Open Class Exhibits*) – Generated \$700, another first-time fundraiser for Crown of Glory. All who participated found this fun and rewarding. We hope to expand this outreach opportunity next year.
- Fall Social – The remaining fundraising goal for 2025 is \$20,000. With the Fall Social we are hoping we can reach that goal! We had increased our fundraising efforts when considering the budget for 2025 in order to balance our budget and maintain our current ministries and programming. The additional new fundraisers have tremendously supported our overall budget, and we're hopeful the Fall Social will bring in the additional support we need. 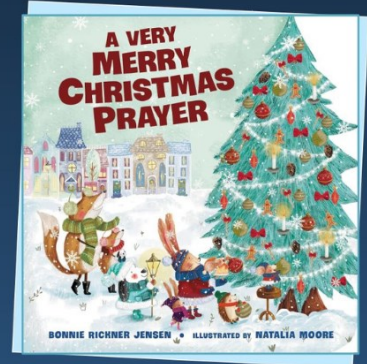
