### From the Desk of Pastor Reggie

### **Rooted in Faith**

Advent will soon be here, and all the dazzling sparkles and all the twinkling lights will be signals for us about what comes next. Before Advent arrives in all its brilliance, we are making our way boldly through our 2024 Stewardship Appeal with our theme, *Rooted in Faith*. One focus area of this year's stewardship season is to change the narrative of 'when' stewardship happens. We all know that it happens the entire month of November every year, but what happens when November is over? Is stewardship over? Of course not! Stewardship is not just a season we go through like any other church season of the year. Stewardship is an ongoing season, part of our faith life together year-round.

This year's stewardship theme is meant to draw us closer to our roots and together in faith. If you have not taken a close look at our mosaic that adorns our central worship wall, just behind the altar, then you should. It is a work of art made from distinctive white pieces of glazed clay. In fact, there are hundreds of pieces that all flow, swirl, grow, reach, and come alive the closer you get to it. The mosaic was designed and created by Crown of Glory member, Peter Potter. Peter created the mosaic in tandem with the Worship Arts Ministry team back in 2016. The mosaic is meant to represent the life of the people who gather in the space that it adorns. It represents roots, water, earth, stalks, stems, leaves, light, growing, becoming, and reaching upwards towards the Creator. All these images come alive as we live into being rooted in our faith.

Stewardship is not just one season, it is a lifetime of sharing our time, talents, wealth, and gifts. Our stewardship is a response to being rooted in faith together. If you have not read your Stewardship Appeal packet, then you should know that now more than ever, Crown of Glory faces new challenges ahead for the remainder of the year that we must face together. Our current financial contributions do not support the hiring of new staff for our Children, Youth, and Family Ministry and our music ensemble director positions. These are vital areas of ministry for our congregation's health and future. While we face these financial challenges together, volunteers have stepped forward to lead these areas of ministry from SPARK Sunday School to the handbell choir. Our Pastors are realigning our calls and duties to meet the demands of other ministries and focus our gifts on those most important to Crown of Glory. We are being rooted in faith as we move forward!

I am excited for the opportunity to journey with you for the rest of our stewardship season and overcome the challenges together in 2024. Join us on November 25 and 26 in giving thanks for all those who have rooted themselves in faith and made a commitment for 2024. Stewardship, rooted in faith, is what guides our future. Thank you for your generosity, your partnership, your support, and renewed faith in our future.

### Siblings in Christ,

This year's season of Advent brings with it an exciting addition to the ministry teams at Crown of Glory: the Worship Arts Team. This talented and passionate team of people has been gathered to lend their creative, passionate, musical, and artistic gifts to the worship life at Crown of Glory. The team met with me for the first time this fall to read Scripture together and listen for themes that they wanted to bring to life for the congregation throughout the seasons of Advent and Christmas. The Worship Arts Team will continue to plan for upcoming seasons throughout the rest of the program year.

In their studying, conversations, and planning, the Worship Arts Team has chosen four themes for the season of Advent: "Stay Awake" (Week 1), "Prepare the Way" (Week 2), "Make Straight the Way" (Week 3), and "Nothing is Impossible with God" (Week 4). Throughout the season of Advent, the congregation will experience these themes in word and song, through color and light, and various representations of creation as described in the passage from Mark cited above.

The season of Advent will end with our annual Christmas Cantata during the 9:00 a.m. service and our annual Children's Narrative at 10:30 a.m. on Sunday, December 17. For the very first time, the Cantata will feature all our musical ensembles: Chancel Choir, Chancel Chimers, Servant Song, and Garage Band. We will also welcome our Christmas Narrative kids to sing one of their prepared songs as part of the Cantata. It will be a wonderful celebration of the musical gifts of this congregation, expressed in a variety of beautiful ways! Our SPARK Sunday School kids will be presenting the Christmas story in their Narrative through word, song, and acting, and it promises to be another fantastic witness of faith and joy. I invite you to attend both performances on December 17, enjoying fellowship and treats in-between, as we celebrate being one family of God together in faith.

Christmas Eve falls on a Sunday this year, which means that we will not have Sunday morning worship at 9:00 a.m. but will wait to gather for our traditional Christmas Eve services at 2:00 p.m., 3:30 p.m., and 5:00 p.m. The Worship Arts Team has planned for another experiential worship that plays with light and color as we gather to welcome the Christ-child and sing praises with the heavenly host. We will enjoy special music from many of our congregational musicians and live into the celebration of the birth of our Savior.

The seasons of Advent and Christmas invite us to remember who we wait for and celebrate, not only this time of year, but each day of our lives: Jesus Christ, Emmanuel, God With Us. As we face these holy seasons and all that they will bring, the joys and the griefs, may we remember to find moments of intention and patience amid the planning and the busyness. May we ground ourselves in the promise of the birth of our Savior and what that means for us and for this world that continues to groan in pain and violence, and may we look for the falling of the stars and listen for the heavenly host, announcing the arrival of Hope among us once again.

### **Justice & Inclusion Team**

"The Justice & Inclusion Team is called by grace to foster community, work for equality, ally with our neighbors, and educate ourselves and others to challenge the forces that seek to exclude, harm, or discriminate against any child of God."

**Reconciling in Christ** 

The Justice & Inclusion Team has worked since June of 2022 to discern whether Crown of Glory could become a Reconciling in Christ (RIC) congregation. Churches that identify as RIC congregations seek to include and welcome people of all genders, races and sexual orientations. For more than a year and a half, our team has taken assessments, educated ourselves, completed one-to-one interviews, and educated the congregation through Adult Forums.

Our next step in the RIC process is to write a welcoming statement that is unique to our faith community. This statement will show visitors, as well as members, what we believe as a congregation about welcoming LGBTQIA+ persons and persons of other races. Other Crown of Glory members and friends are welcome to join us in writing this statement.

Then, we will conduct an anonymous congregational survey to determine if there is sufficient support for the welcoming statement. We need at least 75% congregational approval in order to proceed. The final step is to hold a vote, according to our constitutional bylaws, about including this statement on our website and becoming an official RIC church.

### Finance Corner and Council Members

Our 2023 annual net income/(loss) budget goal this year is \$(27,742). As presented and approved at the 2023 Congregational Meeting, Crown of Glory will be building back to a balanced budget over 3 years. As of 11/15/2023, our end of December projections are expected to be at \$(27,348), but these projections are based on receiving the holiday increase we have in previous years, based on trends of \$70,000. We continue to have monthly expenses greater than monthly revenues (this includes contributions and rental income).

With the lower than expected staffing expenses due to vacant positions, as well as increases in other revenue such as Wednesday dinners, increased Thrivent gifts, hospitality donations and fundraisers, we are on track to end the year at budget. As a reminder, our budget is based on the goal to increase attendance and contributions over the next three years, not rely on decreased staff and other sources of revenue for financial stability. We have some reserves, but we need to evaluate what other steps we can take to help the deficit. We have come through difficult financial realities in the past and expect to find a solution with your help. Please consider an increase in your gifts for the remainder of the year if you are able so that we can move towards hiring additional staff to support our ministries and fulfill our mission.

When my family and I moved to Chaska from Baltimore in 2016, we went looking for a church home with a tacit understanding that we would not become "joiners." I served on the Council at our church in Maryland, and I knew how much emotional energy is required to do the job well. "I just want to join a church," I told my husband, Matt. "I don't need to join all the things that go with it."

But a person can only say "No" to Pastor Reggie a certain number of times. And while I knew that joining the Council would carry a lot of emotional weight, I also knew that the payout would be worth it in a million different ways.

I began my first term on the Crown of Glory Council in March of 2021. At that time, all the Council's meetings were still virtual, a move that had required approval the year before, when life in the virtual space was just beginning. By the time I joined the Council, conferences over Zoom and conversations over FaceTime had become second nature to all of us. This Council was entering into the much more challenging work of discerning how to be the Church in a world after Covid.

I served as Vice President of our Council for two years in the midst of all these uncertainties. I saw the workings of the church from the inside and developed a deep appreciation for the monumental work we ask of our staff. I heard from so many of you about the rich traditions that make Crown of Glory so special, while also learning of a desire to do more and to do better. Church Council meetings could sometimes be contentious during these times—navigating what a church could be in this strange, new world—but my fellow Council members approached every conversation from a place of love: a love for Crown of Glory and a deep love and respect for one another.

As we continue to navigate this path forward, the tenor of the meetings now is slightly different. The current Council is filled with optimism, focused on working together to find unique solutions to the problems that linger for so many churches in this post-Covid world. Our Council still actively disagrees, but we do so in a way where we wonder together how best to move Crown of Glory forward.

When I leave Council next March, I hope the members that remain—and the new members who join—continue to actively, professionally and lovingly disagree. I hope they continue to hold Crown of Glory in the heart of every conversation and every decision. And I hope that they are always united around our common mission to welcome others, serve our neighbors, and share God's rich love and amazing grace.

If you have ever doubted whether you could serve on Council, I would encourage you to do so! Be part of the group that is shaping the future of Crown of Glory and experience life-changing transformations of your own.


